

What a quick – but busy – Spring Term at Jerry Clay Academy! Our children have continued to strive to be the best that they can be, building on the fantastic work that they did in the Autumn Term!

Throughout the term, each class has visited a different place of worship – part of our progressive plan set out in the JCA Pupil Passport. These meaningful visits have provided children the opportunity to be great inquirers and thinkers whilst, ultimately, growing their knowledge about the religion they are studying in class.





Building on from the INSET day at the start of term, our children have really benefitted from developing their **Oracy skills**. Classes have built upon the school's new Speaking and Listening rules and staff have experimented with a range of techniques to develop Oracy in the classroom.
